Every time we look at the Lord's table it is a reminder that because of God's love for us, we must now love those around us. And to not do that and still come to the table is to approach the table in an unworthy manner.
This last supper was so important because Jesus was telling His disciples, and us, that how we live and how we show love to others matters. If we can get this right as a church body first, then a watching world will see Jesus in us and they will find the hope and answers that they have been so desperately looking for.
Jesus comes and says I am creating a new table where are welcome - all tribes, all nations, all peoples, all ethnicities, all abilities, all demographics - all one coming together around the One who saved them.
If we prioritize our in Christ first, we'll naturally feel a stronger connection with a believer from a different culture than with someone from our own culture, demographic, or political party who doesn't have a relationship with Jesus.
Bottom Line: "Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are My disciples, if you love one another." (John 13:34-35)
