Sermon: Part 6: Crashing A Party **Date:** Sunday, August 10th, 2025

"Do not judge, or you too will be judged." (Matthew 7:1)

When one of the Pharisees invited Jesus to have dinner with him, He went to the Pharisee's house and reclined at the table. A woman in that town who lived a sinful life learned that Jesus was eating at the Pharisee's house, so she came there with an alabaster jar of perfume. As she stood behind Him [Jesus] at His feet weeping, she began to wet His feet with her tears. She wiped His feet with her hair, kissed them, and then poured perfume on them. (Luke 7:36-38)

In front of everyone, she walked out of the shadows of her sin in order to embrace the Light of the World.

Have you ever gotten to the point where you were so broken by your sin and failures that you just broke down and cried in front of God because you didn't like what you have done and who you have become?

When the Pharisee who had invited Him [Jesus] saw this, he said to himself, "If this Man were a prophet, He would know who is touching Him and what kind of woman she is - that she is a sinner." (Luke 7:39)
