Sermon: Part 7: The Bleeding Woman

Date: Sunday, August 17th, 2025

Synoptic Gospels: Books of Matthew, Luke, and Mark (all eye witness accounts that are similar in style and in the way they tell the stories of Jesus)

Jesus got into the boat again and went back to the other side of the lake, where a large crowd gathered around Him on the shore. Then a leader of the local synagogue, whose name was Jairus, arrived. When he saw Jesus, he fell at His feet, pleading fervently with Him. “My little daughter is dying,” he said. “Please come and lay Your hands on her; heal her so she can live.” Jesus went with him, and all the people followed, crowding around Him. A woman in the crowd had suffered for twelve years with constant bleeding. She had suffered a great deal from many doctors, and over the years she had spent everything she had to pay them, but she had gotten no better. In fact, she had gotten worse. (Mark 5:21-26 NLT)

From This Account We Learn That:

1. In the Kingdom of God there are no social _____

Regardless of the cause of her ailment, there were religious and social implications with her medical problem.

Scripture referenced in sermon message: Leviticus 15:25-29 NLT

_____ did not necessarily mean sinful or immoral, but “it represented a kind of unworthiness that cannot come in contact with what is Holy.”

This woman was at the bottom of society and she was desperate because everything she tried had failed.

For God does not show favoritism. (Romans 2:11 NLT)

2. In the Kingdom of God we can _____ as we are

She had heard about Jesus, so she came up behind Him through the crowd and touched His robe. For she thought to herself, “If I can just touch His robe, I will be healed.” (Mark 5:27-28 NLT)

She had lost everything but she _____ that Jesus was the answer. She had heard about Jesus’ miracles and wonders. She had heard about His power.

Immediately the bleeding stopped, and she could feel in her body that she had been healed of her terrible condition. (Mark 5:29 NLT)



3. In the Kingdom of God we receive _____ healing

Jesus realized at once that healing power had gone out from Him, so he turned around in the crowd and asked, "Who touched My robe?" His disciples said to him, "Look at this crowd pressing around You. How can You ask, 'Who touched Me?'" But He kept on looking around to see who had done it. Then the frightened woman, trembling at the realization of what had happened to her, came and fell to her knees in front of Him and told Him what she had done. And He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well. Go in peace. Your suffering is over." (Mark 5:30-34 NLT)

Notice her courage in coming forward to tell her story.

Healing is experienced in _____.

But to all who believed Him and accepted Him, He gave the right to become children of God. (John 1:12 NLT)

The miracle we most need is accessible to us right now: it is loving communion with God, forgiveness of our sins, and the adoption into His family.

Now if we are children, then we are heirs - heirs of God and co-heirs with Christ... (Romans 8:17 NIV)

Sharing our story is part of our healing process.

"I tell you the truth, anyone who believes in Me will do the same works I have done, and even greater works, because I am going to be with the Father." (John 14:12 NLT)

Bottom Line: Healing is experienced in community.
